**FUNDING ALLOCATION**

**PARK IMPROVEMENT: \$116,446**

A program to fund projects in parks within low- and moderate-income target areas and improve ADA accessibility in parks throughout the city of Sherman, promoting general health and wellness among the entire community. Focus will especially be to benefit those living in low-moderate income areas and those with disabilities.

**PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION: \$43,155**

The City uses the Administration funds for personnel and support for all phases of the application process, environmental reviews, fair labor standard compliance, contract management, fair housing Grantee Performance Report, and preparation of the Amended Plan.

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM: \$86,720**

A program to provide help to low income Sherman residents affected by COVID-19 with utility bills, rent payments, or childcare tuition. Assistance would cover one activity for no more than three months per household.

**PUBLIC SERVICE ACTIVITIES: \$258,150**

**BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF SHERMAN, INC.: \$30,000**

A program to maintain virtual Club for outreach, and for staff to be trained and fully prepared for the 2020 summer program, which is predicted to be significantly affected by COVID-19. A program to provide scholarships to children whose families have been affected by COVID-19 and to purchase disinfecting and protection supplies to maintain a clean environment to safely serve children.

**CASA OF GRAYSON COUNTY: \$6,500**

A program to train and support volunteer advocates and staff on process and procedures to advocate for foster children in Grayson County that have been abused or neglected. COVID-19 has reduced funding and increased training costs and need for volunteer advocates.

**CHILD & FAMILY GUIDANCE CENTER OF TEXOMA: \$22,000**

A program to provide counseling services for family dysfunction, alcohol and substance abuse, domestic violence, and sexual abuse for low- and moderate-income Sherman residents affected by COVID-19.

**CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER: \$45,000**

A program to provide high quality services to abused and traumatized children. COVID-19 has significantly impacted child victims of abuse and violent crimes resulting in increases in instances of abuse, the severity of abuse cases, and children witnessing violent crimes.

**FOUR RIVERS OUTREACH: \$24,000**

A program that serves those who are overcoming their struggles with addiction by providing a men's residential 16-bed facility and a 12-month Life Renewal program. Recipients are those who, at one time, resided within the city limits of Sherman and have been affected by COVID-19.

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION: \$25,000**

A program to support nutrition, specifically food for low- and moderate-income Sherman residents. Funding will support the additional expenses incurred from COVID-19.

**HOUSE OF ELI: \$15,000**

A program to purchase nutritious food such as meat, eggs, fresh fruits, and vegetables to meet the increased need created by COVID-19.

**MULTICULTURAL FAMILY CENTER: \$7,000**

A program to provide educational programs consisting of ESL classes, citizenship courses, learning and understanding rights, family reading, and literacy to families who have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.

**SHERMAN YOUTH SPORTS ASSOCIATION: \$33,650**

A program to provide scholarships to players whose families have been financially affected by COVID-19.

**TEXOMA FAMILY SHELTER/GRAYSON COUNTY SHELTER: \$50,000**

A program of activities that will provide emergency assistance to homeless individuals and families, who at one time, resided within the city limits of Sherman and have been affected by COVID-19.

**TOTAL PROGRAM ALLOCATION: \$504,471**
